Greetings from Pastor Ric...

"How long, O Lord?" What's next?

For 14 weeks, we didn't meet for in-person worship at our beautiful sanctuary at New Hope because of the Covid-19 threat. It seemed like such a long time to wait before conditions for a safe return were possible. Again, we cried out to God, "How long, O Lord, how long?" I sure missed seeing everyone in worship.

I was glad we could offer virtual worship online through the Faith UMC in the Falls. I appreciated their hospitality and teamwork so we could offer worship experiences to everyone at home during this time of separation.

I also missed visiting our care ministry members in their care facilities and homes. We have lost four members since March: Ruth Bub, Dorothy DeMunck, Joanne Garner, and Carolyn Leynse. We miss them very much.

Now we have started worshipping in the Sanctuary again since Sunday, June 21st! I appreciate the careful work of the Administrative Board and the Reopening committee to create a safe and healthy plan for us to follow as we resume worship in person in our beautiful sanctuary. We have studied the recommendations of the Wisconsin Conference and the Church Mutual Insurance guidelines among other experts. We are aware of the Pentecostal church in nearby Sheboygan Falls that had a virus outbreak recently affecting 23 of their church members coming down testing positive. I prayerfully hope that they all recover and that we don't have the same outcome while we start-up again.

We have heard what simple steps we need to do to minimize the risk of infection for others and ourselves: 1. Wash our hands for 20 seconds (long enough to pray the Lord's Prayer), 2. Stay home, if possible, or stay socially distanced by at least 6 feet when in public, and 3. Wear a mask to cover your nose and mouth when you are out with others. Experience has shown that infection rates drop when we follow these guidelines. And experience is also showing us that infection rates are climbing in areas where we ignore them.

I know there is much resistance to accepting these guidelines. People want to get back to regular life again, for work and businesses to reopen, and to socially gather with friends again. I can understand those feelings too. However, I found on Facebook someone who posted their reasons for wearing a mask:

I wear my mask while in public for 3 reasons:

1. Humility: I don't know if I have COVID as it is clear that people can spread the disease before they have symptoms.

2. Kindness: I don't know if the person I am near has a kid battling cancer, or cares for their elderly mom. While I might be fine, they might not.

3. Community: I want my community to thrive, businesses to stay open, employees to stay healthy. Keeping a lid on COVID helps us all!

I agree with all of these reasons and urge everyone to share these values while infection fears are active, real, and life-threatening for others and us. I look forward to the day when the fears of infection can be behind us, and we can laugh and hug and shake hands and sing with gusto in worship again! But, until then, I pray that we stay safe and healthy as best we can. Looking ahead after the pandemic is finished, what will our world be like? What will our ministry be like? I have read many people who are already thinking forward to that future time. I would like to hear your thoughts about your vision for our church's vision for the years ahead when we no longer need to worry about this global pandemic.

Almost everyone I read says that doing ministry and worship online is here to stay and will need to expand. We, here at New Hope, don't have that ability right now, but I believe we could with some help. We could start slow and inexpensive, and then grow our virtual ministry capability over time.

Recently, I received an email from the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation who is helping local congregations start or continue their online presence as well as open their doors for worship by offering a special "New Way" Grant. Grants are up to \$1,000 per church. All United Methodist Churches in Wisconsin are eligible to apply. The grant funds can be used for video or recording equipment for online worship, online video services (such as ZOOM), online or digital giving services, or equipment and supplies for reopening church buildings. The deadline is August 15, so we need to discuss if we wish to apply.

As a faithful people, we need to continue trusting the Lord to care for us when we feel threatened. We also need to trust the public health experts who have studied this pandemic and are using their God-endowed wisdom to find ways to keep us safe and discover the vaccine to eradicate this virus.
